Penberth

Our class continues to learn about nature; this week we have observed and compared different types of seeds and bulbs predicting what will grow out of them. We are beginning to enter information into our Sunflower Diaries as we observe their germination and growth. We are learning about beat and rhythm in music and we explore how music helps our imagination. Reception children started learning about 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and we focused on learning days of the week, including spelling each day's name.

Gwenver

This week in Gwenver we have welcomed four baby caterpillars! The children have been excited to watch them double in size in just a few days!

In maths the children have been learning about edges and vertices on 3D shapes. We have been looking at lines of symmetry and repeating patterns; relating our maths work to our minibeast topic.

In literacy this week the children have been eagerly writing about our new class pets. They have been finishing off their own books titled "How to be an earthworm" and have also written some brilliant book reviews for our chosen story "Aaaarrrghhhh Spider" by Lydia Monks.

Nanjizal

This week we have been learning about the Anglo-Saxon kings - the kingdoms they ruled, how long they reigned and what they were like as a ruler. In English, we have continued working on the epic Anglo-Saxon poem 'Beowulf'. We've been expressing emotions through the show-not-tell technique. They designed a terrifying monster and generated powerful verbs to express their movements. In maths, we've been learning about turns and angles. They are well on their way to becoming angle experts. A polite reminder that we expect your child to read regularly, play on TTRS and spelling shed (ideally every day).

Porthcurno

In Porthcurno Class this week we are continuing with great enthusiasm on our topic of World War II. We've seen some fantastic persuasive language and writing against the burning of books and the class have been looking into the holocaust in more depth. In maths we are continuing to look at fractions, this week have been adding and subtracting mixed numbers. Our science this term is all about light and this week we looked at how light is refracted when it passes from one transparent material to another-very strange things happen!
