Penberth

This week we have looked at transient art and created original pieces of artwork whilst working in groups, exchanging ideas and compromising to produce lovely results. We also continue to look at plants and this week we looked closely at different fruit and vegetables working out which part of plants we are eating. As part of our study of bugs this week we were looking at naming and understanding the functions of different body parts of the honey bee.

Nanjizal

This week we have been learning about Sutton Hoo, the most impressive archaeological find to date (in England). The children fully immersed themselves into some drama, acting out the sequence of the great find. We discussed their views on whether Mrs Pretty should give the impressive haul to the British Museum or keep it. The majority of them thought she should donate it as it's priceless and should be appreciated by all. The artefacts are on display in the British Museum. In English, the children have written their own defeat the monster myths using y3/4 grammatical features. In maths, we have been adding and subtracting money, comparing amounts and the value of pounds and pence (tens, ones. tenths and hundredths).

Gwenver

This week in Gwenver we have been exploring halves, quarters and thirds in maths. We have completed some of our maths work outside this week - before the strong winds took hold!

The class caterpillars have grown even more and we have explored the life cycle of a caterpillar to understand the huge and magnificent changes our caterpillars will undertake in the coming weeks.

In literacy we have been looking at verbs, adverbs and rhyming words. The children have created their own mini beast class poem to share with the other KS1 children.

Porthcurno

This week Porthcurno Class have done some more fabulous writing. They completed their persuasive letters to Hitler asking him to stop persecuting the Jews and then they wrote to their pen pals in Australia and told them all about the beautiful part of the world that they live in. We are finishing off our fractions work this week. We've been so impressed with the children's positivity and resilience throughout this tricky topic. The class have been really enjoying their WW2 topic work and thank you so much to those parents who sent in a secret letter for their child. We opened them up and shared all of the amazing stories this week. We have also almost finished our class book Once and the children are literally begging us to read on, we are so gripped!
