

GWENVER

This week we celebrated Poetry Week by learning about two different poems. We had great fun performing them, thinking of the different characters as well as putting on voices and expressions that reflected the characters. We also analysed the poems learning what they were about and what kind of language was used in each. In the afternoons we carried out a DT project learning how to de-

sign and build a castle, following instructions, measuring each element using a ruler and connecting the elements without using any glue. In maths we have been looking at ordering objects and numbers using mathematical language and symbols: greater than >, less than < and equal to =. In music Mrs Crow has been teaching us how to play 3 different songs on xylophones by following patterns and rhythm.





NANJIZAL

This week we've been learning about different types of volcanoes. They were surprised by the time frame used to classify dormant and active volcanoes. We have been looking at the different types of fossils and how they were formed. They were lucky enough to get hands on experience with Mrs K's fossil collection.

In maths, we have reached the end of our place value block and we will be moving onto addition and subtraction next week.

In English, we have continued with our block of poetry.

PORTHCURNO

This week Porthcurno Class have been looking further at gravity in our topic work. They have looked at the life of Sir Isaac Newton, discovered how gravity can affect your weight, and at how to weigh objects in newtons using a newton meter. They

have been developing their understanding of writing vivid character descriptions in English and celebrated Nation Poetry Day on Thursday with a study of the Poem The Highwayman by Alfred Noyse. In Maths this week they have completed their unit on addition and subtraction and moved on to multiplication and division, beginning with multiples, factors and common factors. In forest school this week we had a great session where children got to make and cook damper bread. After requesting more digging activities, the children have begun making wooden rafts and have dug a channel with a view to trying to float them down our temporary stream! They are also really enjoying making dens and helping with ongoing garden development. We can't wait for you all to see it. This week and last week

has also seen many of our year 6s and some year 5s visiting some of the local secondary schools. It is great to get this exposure to the 'big' schools in preparation for when they leave at the end of year 6 and they are always full of interesting stories to share
