This week Y1's have been continuing their exploration of patterns within the 100 square and understanding of place value. In literacy we 'read' the wordless picture book 'Bee and me' and the children inferred meaning from the pictures, writing speech and thought bubbles; we also wrote some wonderful recipes for bee medicine using imperative 'bossy' verbs. Y1&2 learned about dependency and food chains in Science.

Reception children have been focusing on sharing equal groups and recognising how we can add or subtract to make equal groups. We have also finished our very own books taking Inspiration from the Very Hungry Caterpillar, and the children are very excited to take them home.

Nanjizal

This week we've concluded our Viking topic. The children have finished writing, editing and final draft writing of their Viking stories. In maths, we've finished our block on decimals by ordering, rounding and working out equivalent fractions. Sports' Day (take 2) was a huge success. This week in Gwenver we have been focusing on position and direction in Maths. The children have had fun exploring activities and challenges related to this topic.

In phonics we have been revising all of the phonic phases and consonant clusters.

In literacy the children have spent time innovating our focus story for the end of term 'Aaarrggghhhh Spider'.

The children had lots of fun at Sports Day, and I was so proud of their behaviour and the support that they gave to the younger children.

Porthcurno

This week Porthcurno Class have been rounding off their WW2 topic making some TV news reports based on their wonderful letters that they received from family and friends. It has been a great opportunity for them to work collaboratively as a group and practice empathising in their role play. Some people really shone as leaders, others enjoyed the lime light and some preferred a backstage role, organising props. In maths they have been looking at shape and angles. They looked at using a protractor, angles on a straight line and angles around a 360° turn.
