Gwenver (Year 2)

Gwenver have been busy thinking of their favourite toys and how they can describe them using different adjectives. We then created sentences and thought really carefully about how we can structure them. In maths we have been busy practicing counting up in different numbers and thinking how digits can create various numbers in different orders.

Nanjizal (Year 3/4)

We are well into our Stone Age Topic now and on Tuesday we took a trip to the ancient settlement at Carn Euny (take a look at the pictures on our class page). We investigated the site, exploring the fogou and the underground room, before a drawing and writing activity. In spite of some good hiding places, I eventually found everybody and we came back tired and happy. In literacy we are learning strategies to help with our reading comprehension - children, can you tell an adult the 4 steps we use?

Porthcurno (Year 5/6)

This week the class have really kick started their Romans topic. They have been looking at timelines of key events in Roman history. In maths, the class has been getting really practical to secure their understanding of big numbers up to 10 million. The maths mastery approach is allowing them to better understand the numbers and talk and reason with them too. It's great to watch their confidence grow! They have also started writing their Oktapodi stories and are keen to present them as books to some of the younger children in school.
