### **HEAD'S WELCOME**

Welcome to another or our newsletters!

We have had a focus on how to stay safe online with Internet Safety week being held this week. In our assemblies we have looked at the importance of computers and technologies before beginning to think about what actions we can take to ensure that we all stay safe online. On Thursday Mrs Wilson, who leads our Computing curriculum, gave a special assembly about internet safety where we thought about this year's theme: 'All fun and games: exploring respect and relationships online'. All of our children had a lot of insight on the topic and demonstrated good knowledge on how to stay safe when using the internet in a variety of forms, but at the same time, they all learnt lots too! It is apparent that a lot of our children use various forms on the internet for a variety of reasons, at home this is mostly for online games. It is really important that children are well-supervised when playing online and that what they do online is shared with you. It is really important that parents and carers are aware of the content their children are seeing and hearing online and, especially as they get older, are even sharing. We deeply encourage parents to know who their children engage with online, and even if playing with their friends online, that you know about the language they may hear or even use themselves in these games. Children's break and lunch times are such an important part of the day for a variety of reasons. Children love to spend their own time in their own ways, whether it be playing football on the field, tackling our trim trial, playing basketball, being on the apparatus or playing any of their own games. For others, they love to just relax and read a book, write or draw. That is why our break times are accessible for all and we advocate our 'Playground Library', where children can have a quiet space to read outdoors. We also now have a writing and drawing box where children can spend their time practicing mindfulness and drawing, colouring or writing creatively. It is really great to see our children accessing a range of activities at this special time. From next half term some of our year 5 and 6s have volunteered themselves to take on a Playground Leader role where they will support and run lunch time activities for our children in the school. It is great that our children have these leadership responsibilities and are so keen to play an active part in all areas of school life; for example, being a buddy with a younger child to being one of our many monitors responsible for an area across the school it is important to encourage this aspect of school life so that our children learn to make valuable contributions to our community, examples of which we have already seen in our children who take part in village cleans and more.


