There are a few things to inform you of in advance of the coming weeks. First though, some exciting things to share!

This week we celebrated neuro-diversity week. This was all about recognising, learning about and acknowledging those that have, or may have, what they call 'hidden disabilities' such as: ADHD, autism, dyslexia, dyspraxia and more.

We learnt how we can support people who may have these conditions and how we can celebrate them too. Our children showed great understanding and togetherness, thinking carefully about how these conditions should not be barriers to aspirations; we looked at how famous people who have some of these conditions have gone on to reach and surpass their hopes and dreams too. We concluded our celebration of neuro-diversity week by wearing our odd-socks today and hope that what was learnt this week stays with everybody going forward.

Today we formally opened our garden area during our whole school celebration assembly; we were lucky enough to hold it outside in our garden! We were joined by our former Chair of Governors, Mrs Anita George, and former-governor, Dr Paddy Hersant to thank them for the service that they have given the school for over 20 years. It was decided that the garden would be called 'Anita's Garden' in honour of all Mrs George has done for us, and continues to do so. Mrs Diana Hardy, our current Chair, also joined us for the celebration. We hope to open our garden to everybody soon and to involve our community in the project; it really is a legacy project for the school and it is something that we hope our children now - and in the future - look back on with pride knowing that they have been part of it.

Thank you to Aaron Smith for designing and producing such an amazing sign for the garden and to Mrs Wilson and her family for all of the time they have put into the project; as well as to everybody else who has generously donated time, resources and more into the project.

From next week we will be opening up our playground gates for 'collection time' to ensure that there is more space for families. The gates will be open at 3.10pm ready for when each class come out. Teachers will dismiss children from the 'number square', so please leave that area free. If your child brings their bike, trike or scooter to school, please make sure that they are by your side at this time and not going around the playground to help ensure that there are no collisions. You are welcome to stay until 3.45pm, when we will be closing the gates. Children will be allowed to use the apparatus but please adhere to the clear instructions that are on display; during this time children will be in the care of parents and in order to continue to use the equipment, please ensure that the instructions are being followed - thank you.

We also ask that if your child is to go home with somebody other than who they normally go home with, please notify the school in advance so that we are aware at dismissal time.

As we begin to enter the final term of school, please ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform and adhering to our uniform policy, this includes their footwear. Although there is a degree of flexibility within our PE uniform, children are still expected to wear the correct clothes for school. This is especially important for our Key Stage 2 children as they begin to work with secondary schools, in particular, those in year 6.

The Friends of the school would like to ask if children could please bring in an Easter themed treat next week (eggs or sweets) for our Easter raffle this year.


These can be given to teachers on arrival or registration over the course of next week.


