

As part of our RE topic: 'How Christians are active in Penzance', we have been talking about the Church's Penzance food bank. Gwenver (Year 2)

This week Gwenver have impressed with their mathematical knowledge and how they can relate their number bonds to 10 to lots of other areas of mathematics. We learnt that having a sound understanding of the fundamentals of maths can help with lots of things. In English we have really been practicing selecting the right words and vocabulary to give clear instructions. It has made us think about how we form sentences to make sure that what we are saying or writing is as clear as possible.

Nanjizal (Year 3/4)

All our pupils showed great flexibility in their work this week as we have had a few changes, being able to adapt and still learn is a super skill to have. In maths we have moved our focus to multiplication, starting with the patterns found in the x2, x4 and x8 tables. Please practice at home and include division questions like "how many 4s are in 20?" On Friday we had a 'bridge building challenge' as I want everyone to be able to construct a Christmas decoration that stands by itself.

Porthcurno (Year 5/6)

What an amazing trip to The Eden Project we had! The children were such a credit to the school and they astounded and shone with their fantastic, broad knowledge in the workshops and super attitude. It is so great to make their learning real and relevant. Talking about Darwin's visit to the rainforest followed by an actual trip to a rainforest is just the best way to learn! Please can children keep learning their lines for the Christmas play; we will be starting full rehearsals next week and really need children to know their lines off by heart.
