Admissions and Attendance

We now accept pre-reception children. If you are interested in your child joining our school you are welcome to call us on 01736 810480 for details and to arrange a visit.

It is important that you and your child develop a positive attitude to school attendance and punctuality so that they do not miss out on the opportunities at school. These qualities of reliability are also important in adult life.

Assessment and Reporting

We enter each childs attainment details on our whole school tracking system so that we can closely monitor each childs progress every half term and put intervention strategies in place, if necessary.

Formal parent-teacher interviews are held at the beginning and end of each school year but parents are welcome to make an appointment to see their childos class teacher at any time, if necessary. Class tea parties are held to inform parents about what is happening in their childos class over a cup of tea or coffee and some refreshments.

Regular, high quality marking of childrences work attempts, whenever possible, to enter into a dialogue with learners to help them understand the next steps they need to take, in order to extend and be responsible for, their own learning.

Extended School Provision

Our school offers a free breakfast club for all our children where a reasonably priced breakfast menu is available from 8am.

Activities R Usqis our after school club, providing a host of exciting activities from 3.15-5.30pm. There is a charge of £3.50 for this session. For parents who may prefer to pick their children up before 4pm we have a charge of just £1. Booking is flexible on a daily basis.

Foundation Stage Learning

Our Early Years classes accept children from 3-5 years.

Our experienced Early Years staff teach small groups of children in a bright, stimulating environment with new outdoor play facilities, including a garden area whilst also enjoying access to the wider school.

There is designated support for any children with Special Educational Needs.

School Choir

The choir perform within the community and also join to sing with other choirs. We believe that singing is good for everyone; the local mixed voice choir, the Pipers Singers, meet weekly at the school.

School Uniform

Winter Uniform: to be worn during Autumn Term (from after Autumn half term at the latest)- through Spring Term until Summer Term begins (i.e. after Easter holiday)

FRIDAY ALTERNATIVE (swimming days only): Jogging bottoms, trainers, red or blue polo shirt

Summer Uniform

Summer dresses may be worn.

Polo shirts may be worn as an alternative to white shirt and tie.

Red polo shirts may be worn as an alternative to blue with school trousers/skirts

Fitted sandals may be worn (no crocs, flip flops or unsupported sandals which prove dangerous in the playground situation).

<u>Sport</u>

At St Buryan Academy we embrace the value of competitive sport in the experiences it provides for later life.

We provide a wide range of sport, including street dance, both within the school day as well as in extra-curricular activities.

We enter local competitions/leagues in football, High 5s, cricket (including Chance to Shine opportunities), swimming, hockey, tag rugby, cross country and athletics.

We are unusual in providing weekly swimming sessions for every child, including Reception.
