SPOTLIGHT ON... THE IMPORTANCE OF RESIDENTIAL EXPERIENCES

Our residential offer is something that we are proud of at St Buryan, and always have been. Many of you as parents may remember your own residential experiences when you were children at our school - or others. Our aim is to provide our children with the experiences and memories that will last a lifetime, as well as helping to sculpt characteristics that help our children grow.

Our Isles of Scilly trip is renowned for being our stand-out residential experience; taking place in children's penultimate and last years of St Buryan Academy in year 5 and 6. The school has been going to the Isles of Scilly for many years now and it has become somewhat of a tradition of the school. We stay at Garrison campsite on St Mary's and explore island life; learning about the history and geography of the islands as well as developing many attributes that make us who we are and strengthen our characters.

Also in Year 5/6 we offer a city residential. We alternate this with IoS so that the children have two contrasting residential experiences in their final years. This gives our children the opportunity to experience different surroundings and a way of life that is vastly different to their own. Whilst there we normally take in some museums, a West End show, the Houses of Parliament and more.

In year 3/4 our children have a two night stay at either a local campsite or even at school! This residential is normally based around adventurous activities that stretch and challenge our children.

We even offer an overnight residential to our year 1s and 2s, which is relatively unique for primary schools. We carry this out at school in an environment that children are familiar with and allows progression in our residential experiences through the school. If you have not heard from your child's class teacher on their residential yet, then you will do in the coming weeks. We feel that they are valuable experiences for our children and, as I said earlier, help create some memories for life. They build courage, resilience, teamwork and develop many more characteristics. It is also great to see friendships blossom and flourish during these opportunities too.

Whilst talking about our residential experiences, a big thanks to our staff who spend a lot of time organising, preparing and then taking our children on these trips, all in their own volunteered time!
