Use your knowledge of ordering numbers to make sure the events are accurately placed on the timeline.	Design and create a Roman helmet or create your own Roman mosaic.	Research Julius Caesar. Write 5 facts about him. Was he a King? Where did he come from? Who did he marry? How do you know he was powerful? What did he look like?	Make your own board game and teach it to your family. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Roman Chariot Race</li> <li>Roman Gladiator</li> <li>Stick the hat on the soldier.</li> </ul>
Imagine you are a Roman slave. Write a diary entry about a day in your life.	Write a story or code using Roman numerals up to 1000.	Choose a Roman invention. Prepare a short presentation, which could be a talk or a slide show to share with the class.	Print a map of Europe (ask Mrs Ayotte if you need one). Decorate each country in a fun way. E.g. using the colours of the flags or pictures of their national dishes.	Roman Numerals - for each member of your family, discuss their date of birth in Roman Numerals.
