Penberth (Reception/Year 1)

Over the last week we have been studying the different theories of dinosaur extinction, which created interesting debates evaluating what the scientists think against our own opinions. The children have also perfected their dinosaur dance routine under Natalie's professional eye. I'm very impressed how well they remember all the movements and routines. We will be showing off our Dinosaur project on Wednesday from 2.30pm.

Gwenver (Year 2)

Gwenver have been busy writing some amazing dinosaur stories, thinking cleverly about how to start their story and what exciting event they can have in it.

We have been so impressed with the children's learning in maths. They have collected tally charts from the whole school and have looked at presenting the information in pictograms and bar charts too. We are now looking at shapes and learning key vocabulary like 'vertices'.

Nanjizal (Year 3/4)

What an exciting and busy week we've had. The children have written newspaper reports about a natural disaster of their choice. We've started a measure, length and perimeter block looking at the equivalent lengths in mm, cm, m and km. A wonderful lady called Sally came in and really inspired their creative writing with edible poetry, song writing and cinquains. The children loved being so creative with their writing. To top off an amazing week we made our model volcanoes erupt!

Porthcurno (Year 5/6)

This week in Porthcurno Class we have been busy tackling some tricky fractions work, the class have shown great determination and problem solving ability when adding and subtracting fractions that don't have the same denominator. We have also finished writing our moon inspired myths and taken time to evaluate and reflect on our own writing skills. Elsewhere in the topic we've been learning about the first moon landingsincredible, brave journeys!
