Penberth (Reception/Year 1)

This week we have been learning our sounds, securing our place value to 10 and getting creative. Year 1 have been learning about old toys and the Christian view of creation, whilst Reception have made different colours of playdough, the recipe can be found on our website page.

Gwenver (Year 2)

This week Gwenver have been busy practising how to improve their handwriting by adding different punctuation and adjectives to their sentences. We have thought carefully about how we can create sentences to engage a reader. In maths we have been looking at representing big numbers in various ways.

Nanjizal (Year 3/4)

This week we have been learning about what life was like when farming first started on the island of Britain, between 5 and 8 thousand years ago. We think of our landscape as natural, but the surface features are almost entirely down to the people who have lived here over the centuries. In maths we have been making sure we are confident with the place value of numbers - next week will see lots of adding and subtracting.

Porthcurno (Year 5/6)

This week in Porthcurno Class, the children have had their first opportunity to visit one of the local secondary schools, heading off to Cape Cornwall School on Wednesday. They were full of excitement on their return. Look out for the upcoming similar events at Mounts Bay Academy and Humphry Davy School. In the classroom, we have been continuing with their Roman topic, working hard on their place value in maths and making the finishing touches on their Oktapodi stories. In P.E, Mr Tremaine has been helping the children to develop their skills as playground leaders and we hope that this will be a really positive way that the older children can support the younger children at break times. It should be lots of fun as well as promoting leadership skills and responsibility for the older children.
