It has been a great week once more here at St Buryan; I am so pleased with how children have settled into new classes and routines. The start of the new school year can be difficult for us all with new expectations, people to be familiar with and being at home for six weeks - so it is really important that we engage our children, we are positive about school life and all that it has to offer.

At the start of term we shared things that we are focusing on this year and I just wanted to remind our parents of these things. We have talked about them in our assemblies this week and it is important that all aspects of the school community know what we want to achieve so that it can be promoted by all:

To raise progress and attainment in writing

Following lockdown and the disruption that brought to school life, writing standards dropped nationally, which is why we want to have a real push on not just bringing them back in-line to what they were pre-COVID, but over and above that. The art of writing is a real skill; we are aiming to promote that in engaging and inspiring ways. It isn't just about writing on a blank page, but doing it for different purposes, audiences and styles so look out for some great writing projects over the year.

How can you help...

Promote writing at home, whether it be as simple as writing their names or messages in a card, letters to families, instructions to family games or taking advantage of any other writing opportunities that present themselves. The key is to make these opportunities worthwhile and not onerous.

To raise attendance figures across the school

Over the past two years children have lost a lot of in-school learning time, so it is vital that they are able to attend school - unless for exceptional circumstances only or illness. We want to raise our attendance average percentage to 97% - in 2019 we were at 96%. From us, we need to continue to develop that love for learning, provide our children with unique learning opportunities and enable them to realise that there are no limitations to what they can achieve.

How can you help...

Ensure that there is no lost learning from school absences. This mean that children should be in school unless for absolute exceptional circumstances and that children are in school on time - remember that our school day starts at 8.45am for Reception to Year 6.

To create collaborative learning across our Trust and community

It is vital that we prepare our children for life in the wider world and help them become positive contributors to society on local and even global scales. We can do this by setting up projects with the schools we already work with within our Trust, Leading Edge, as well as other local schools and even schools across the country and world. We have some exciting projects lined up this year to look forward to.

How can you help...

You can play a key role in collaborative learning by engaging with our family days which will take place across the year or if you are involved in a community club of some sort that may be interested in some partnership work with the school, then let us know!
