PENBERTH

This week Penberth have been working hard learning new sounds and the songs that accompany them. We also listened to 'The Three Little Pigs' and loved joining in with the story. We have been practising our counting and have been singing lots of counting songs. We are also beginning to learn how a calendar works by changing the days in sequence every morning. We've had some fun playing board games and bingo games to support maths too.

Kellie came in and we had our first game of cricket. She is very impressed with the progress we have made.

Our swimming sessions are helping the children in gaining water confidence and basic skills and we can already see the progress they are beginning to make.

GWENVER

We have had a very interesting week in Gwenver class this week! The children have made fantastic progress in their cricket and swimming lessons. In music we have started to learn the ending of our song "Witch, Witch" and we hope to put it all together next week. We also had some time to improvise our own tunes with these notes: C, E, G and A.

BELIEVE ACHIEVE ASPIRE

We have been looking at the story of Rapunzel in more detail, making actions to help us remember the story. We have been practicing our number bonds to 10 and 20 and completed table top number sentences using our whiteboard pens. We also made colourful pasta necklaces, carefully threading each piece of pasta onto a long string. This activity helped to strengthen our fingers to make us fantastic writers.

NANJIZAL

This week, we have learnt about the positives and negatives of living near a volcano. The children then held a debate and unsurprisingly the majority of the class decided against it. In English, we have written setting descriptions about Pompeii, before the catastrophic eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79AD. In Science, we've

continued to learn about fossils, delving into the life of Mary Anning- a famous fossil hunter. In maths, we have been using a formal written method to solve addition and subtraction problems.



PORTHCURNO

This week in Porthcurno class we have been continuing our story writing. After completing our story plans, we began writing our version of La Luna, a short film we have watched, thinking carefully about how to weave powerful descriptions into our writing. The children were eager to get going, their heads full of creative ideas! We have also been learning about real life astronauts and what skills you need to become an astronaut and had fun making craters in sand to replicate those on the moon. In maths we have been learning about prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers this week. It is so lovely to see how the children are growing in confidence this week, feeling more comfortable sharing their ideas and having a go when they find things tricky. Forest school was another glorious, sunny session. This week we continued building our rafts, digging our new wildflower bed and had lots of fun creating a 'stream' for our rafts to flow down. The children have enjoyed these sessions so much and it has been so brilliant to see them caring for and developing this space.
