# <u>History:</u>

 We will learn about the causes of the Second World War and the effects on the people in both allied and axis countries. We will focus on evacuation, rationing, the Blitz, and the Battle of Britain as a significant turning point in the war. We will then look at Cornwall's role in the war.

# <u>Geography:</u>

 We will use maps to locate countries involved in both the Second World War and conflicts happening in more recent times.

## <u>English:</u>

We will begin the term with a Whole School Writing Project based on the picture book 'The Tin Forest' by Helen Ward where we will write setting and character descriptions as well as diary entries and poems.

The rest of the term will be spent writing narratives, based on 'Rose Blanche'; persuasive leaflets and discussion texts linked to evacuation and diaries based on Anne Frank.

We will be reading 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo as our class novel as well as a range of shorter texts and poetry based on WWI and WW2.



## Maths:

This terms maths will focus on:

- Fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Arithmetic and written methods for the 4 operations
- Algebra, ratio, statistics and volume


<u>DT:</u> Steady Hand Game making circuits Art:
