<u>Penberth</u>

This week our Reception children have been delving deeper into story-telling and innovating their own stories based on the Hungry Caterpillar. They have loved working as a team creating story maps and using their art skills to create illustrations for our class story. In maths they have moved onto subtraction and have had lots of fun using class resources to make 'first, then, now' maths stories.

This week in science Y1s took a closer look at life processes and learnt an interesting song to help them to remember all 7. In maths they were learning about quarters, and in literacy they were imagining newly hatched butterflies embarking on their first flight.

<u>Nanjizal</u>

This week we've been busy completing our end of year assessments. The children have all given it their best and I'm so proud of them all. In English, we have been planning our newspaper report about the Viking invasion of Lindisfarne. In Art, we have used charcoal to draw a Viking long-ship. We also learnt about the design and structure of their boats. In topic, we have been learning about Vikings being great traders. In groups, the children have all selected an artefact or item commonly traded to create a 'Dragon's Den' style sales pitch with an accompanying slideshow.

Gwenver

This week in Gwenver we have been exploring the features of familiar stories. Next week the children will be writing their own stories to share with the year 1 children. In phonics the children have been revising the consonant clusters with a little help from Geraldine the giraffe! In guided reading we also met a friendly giraffe that went to school. The children worked in small groups with a different focus each morning. (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation of the text and retrieval of key facts.)

In maths this week we have taken our learning outside. We made 2D shapes out of leaves and sticks and stones: and split these shapes into 1/2 s, 1/3s and 1/4.

Porthcurno

This week Porthcurno Class had a fabulous start with their trip to the Minack Theatre. In the classroom they have shown great maturity in their ability to work independently on our assessments all week. They have also been working hard on their decimals in maths. They have written some wonderfully creative flashback stories and taken great care to edit them and make them their best piece of writing. In Science they enjoyed setting their minds to investigating various aspects of light; making shadows, using reflection to see around corners and using a prism to make a rainbow!
