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Gwenver Visit to Penlee Lifeboat Station

Y1-2 had an exciting and very interesting trip to Penlee Lifeboat Station on Thursday morning to coincide with this half-term's topic 'To the Rescue'. Martin Brockman, Education Officer, showed us some pictures of all the lifeboats that Newlyn have had since the early 1800s, together with fantastic footage of dramatic rescues. He also found some reconstruction footage of the Grace Darling story which some of the children had mentioned to him earlier in the visit as we have been looking at this in class. Patch (Coxswain) and Tony (Engineer) took us aboard the all-weather lifeboat, Ivan Ellen and we were able to investigate the various instruments and equipment on board. We were told all about the different roles of the crew and even found out their favourite food whilst on the lifeboat -'Pringles and corned beef sandwiches!' The children asked lots of interesting and thoughtful questions which demonstrated the knowledge they have gained whilst working on this particular topic. The class came away with deeper understanding and greater knowledge about the role of the RNLI and the important job that lifeboat crews do. Martin also gave us lots of goodies including stickers, pencils and leaflets that we can use back in the classroom. A big thank you to Martin, Patch, Tony and the rest of the team at Penlee Lifeboat Station who made us feel so welcome.
