GWENVER

We have had a wonderful week in Gwenver! In maths this week we have been exploring counting to 100 for the year 1s and focusing on tens and ones in 50 for the year 2s. The children enjoyed our outdoor math session this week exploring shape in our school environment. In literacy we have been focusing on storytelling and traditional tales. We have explored descriptive language in stories and have enjoyed acting these stories in groups. The children also enjoyed swimming, cricket and music sessions this week!





NANJIZAL

This week we've been learning about the properties of rocks. The children put a selection of rocks to the test, to see if they are permeable, dense and durable. I am really impressed with their passion for rocks and thoroughly enjoying seeing their amazing rocky finds. In English, we have been learning about different clauses, identifying them and adding subordinating clauses to add detail. In maths, we've been using known information to work out interval values on number lines (Y3 up to 1,000 & Y4 up to 10,000). They have also been applying their place value knowledge to find 1, 10 or 100 more or less than a 3 digit number.





PORTHCURNO

This week in Porthcurno we've continued our journey around space, learning about Galileo and learning a bit more about the moon! In maths we've been coping really well with some even bigger numbers, up to a million and beyond! We had another great forest school session on Wednesday, it was lovely to see the children getting busy with gardening jobs and getting messy making natural paints using colours from plants and blackberries! They even made their own paint brushes. They also sampled vegetable fritters cooked on the fire! It was so great how many children tasted something new and so full of goodness! They were scrumpy.

BELIEVE ACHIEVE ASPIRE

HEAD LICE

Recently, a case of head lice has been identified in the school and we wanted to make sure you were kept informed. Whilst lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread. As there has been a case, we suggest that you check your child's head as soon as possible. Here is some simple advice you may wish to follow to keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum.

-Check your child's hair once a week.

-Use a proper detection comb – with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart to trap head lice. The comb is usually white in colour so that lice can be easily identified.
